Owning a Vertical Garden

Owning a vertical garden is not any less demanding than tending to a traditional garden. Owners will be required to invest just as much effort into trimming, watering and caring for the plants, with a slightly higher cost. A lot of thought will need to be given to the style of the garden, the type of plants being used and the support structure. Some of the factors that you'll need to take into consideration include.

Why - Vertical Garden?

Why would people choose a vertical garden over a traditional approach? There are several reasons for this. One of these is that planting vertically allows people to create gardens in places that hitherto were impossible. Vertical gardens are an ideal option for places where horizontal real estate is scarce. They can be planted at malls, subway stations and offices without depriving people of their walkway.

Vertical gardens are also a great way of merging the modern sleekness of urban life with the aesthetic beauty of nature. The integration of plants within modern design creates a soothing harmony that most people are likely to appreciate.

Finally, vertical gardens are an appealing option in places plagued with pests. Growing vertical plants will make it more difficult for rodents to eat or damage your beautiful plants.

Lighting

If you plan on growing your plant indoors, then it is vital that you provide ample lighting for the plant's growth and survival. You'll need to choose a plant bulb that provides sufficient light level similar to daylight. Light sources made with a metal halide design are popular choices in this regard.

Plant Choice

There are different plants that may be considered for a vertical garden. The best place to find such options is to visit a Nursery. The best plants for a vertical garden are those that are suited to the temperature in which they will be planted. For instance, Mediterranean plants may be better suited to temperate climates.

Common examples include

- Salvia
- Rosmarinus
- Thymus
- Lavandula
- Stag horn Fern
- Bird nest fern
- Lipstick plant

For people living in tropical climates, Epiphytic plants are a more popular choice. These plants are unaffected by regular rainfall or high humidity levels.
